Most Reverend Frank J. Caggiano, Bishop of Bridgeport, offered words of welcome. "The students and young adults at Saint Catherine's are more than respected," he said. "They are loved and cared for. This is at the heart of the mission of our Diocese." His recognition of Helen Burland, the Center's Executive Director, for her outstanding leadership prompted a standing ovation.

Board Chairman Charles Chiusano then introduced the evening's honorees. Elena and Steve Schlegel of New Canaan received the Leadership Award. "When we announced our expansion plans for the Center, the Schlegels were alongside us, supporting our vision and taking a leadership role in the **Building For the** Future Campaign," Helen said as she announced the award. The kitchen in the new facility will be named after the Schlegel's daughter Katherine, who passed away in 2018. "When we cut the ribbon on the expansion, we will be proud to show everyone 'Kat's Kitchen'—a place where our students and young adults will have an authentic experience planning, preparing, and sharing baked goods from 4-Hearts Bakery."

Virginia Dwyer-Aoyama of Darien was honored with the Volunteer Service Award for her dedication to the development and





implementation of the Library Program at Saint Catherine Academy. "My library days are full of joy, laughter, and spontaneity, making books that I love come alive, singing songs, and doing lots of movement. Who could ask for more fun than that?" Virginia said as she accepted the award. "Through my 13 years of being involved...l've felt part of the Saint Catherine's community—a place where children are loved and accepted for who they are, by their peers and all the staff, and where they are encouraged to be and do all that they're capable of."

The public is welcome to attend the Mass, but space is limited; reservations must be made in advance by calling 203-540-5381.


