A recent trip to the Peabody Museum of Natural History in New Haven inspired awe and amusement as the Adult Program toured a variety of exhibits, including the exhibition's highlight—a mummy at rest in a decorated tomb. Some visitors were interested in the prehistoric birds. Others enjoyed the ants marching from one colony to another in clear, room-length tubes. A giant live tarantula in the Insects exhibit caught everyone's attention, as did the dinosaur skeletons in The Great Hall.

audible descriptions made exhibits accessible and reinforced sensory perception and identification skills practiced at the Center.

Special Needs Mass on December 2

All are welcome to the annual Mass Celebrating People with Special Needs, hosted by Saint Catherine Center on Sunday, December 2, at 2 p.m. at Holy Cross Church in Fairfield, adjacent to the Center.

Families of children with disabilities often hesitate to seek the sacraments of Baptism, Holy Communion, and Confirmation for their children, feeling unsure about how their son or daughter may fit in the preparation classes. Many families do not know that accommodations and modifications can be made so their child can receive these sacraments.
